#### Kitah Bet/Gimel ביתה ב/ג (grades 2/3) Sundays 9-11 am

Explores holidays, mitzvot / values, Torah stories and Hebrew letters, through stories, movement, and crafts with **Rabbi Tziona Szajman**.

#### Kitah Dalet/Hey ה'תה ד\ר (grades 4/5) Sundays 9 am - 12 pm

Focuses on Hebrew language skills, Jewish culture and history, holiday rituals and songs, with **Miranda Phillips.** 

#### Kitah Vav/Zayin ליתה ו/ו (grade 6/7) Sundays 9 am - 12 pm

Studies weekly Torah portions and the life lessons they contain, along with contemporary connections and creative art and games with **Kenny Berkowitz.**

Students become a supportive community as they prepare together to become bmitzvah, exploring spirituality, ethics, mitzvot, middot (personal characteristics), and prayers with **Michael Margolin**. Field trips and special projects are part of the program. **Jacob Berman**, a Cornell University student, will be assisting on Wednesdays.

Madrichol מדריכול are assistants/counselors. At JLE, madrichim are middle and high school students who help with numerous tasks that allow our classes to run smoothly. They take attendance, lead craft projects, demonstrate activities, distribute snack, make photocopies, supervise break times, and tutor individual students and small groups. These fabulous young people are graduates of JLE who come back each week to pass along their knowledge and enthusiasm for Jewish education.

### Jewish Learning Experiences continues to include these components, which are all are part of Limud (learning): לימוד

- \* Chugim דוגים (not "ch" as in "change" but "CH" as in "CHallah.") Special projects including art, drama, dance, music, and more, with plenty of choice for students about how they want to spend their time
- \* Judaic Studies Including history, holidays, mitzvot, and Talmud Torah
- \* Hebrew עברית (Ivrit) Students learn to decode the letters and vowels and read Hebrew for participation and leadership in prayer services, with an understanding of the meanings of the words.
- \* Hafsakah (break / snack) הפסקה Learning blessings for food, eating, and playing together is also important!
- \* Ha'asharah העשרה (enrichment from special guests) Scheduled guests for this year already include: Leah Shoshanah (October 19), Arlene Schensker and Gebyanesh Addisu, authors of *Call Me Gebyanesh* (November 16). Jewish artists and Israeli folk dancers, Jewish camp leaders, and others are often our guest teachers.
- \* Tefillah: (prayer) תפלה: All students in dalet-zayin join together most mornings for songs and short prayer services to practice what we are learning, with plenty of *ruach* רוח (spirit and singing). Praying together as a community is an important way for children to practice what they are learning in class, build on their knowledge of Hebrew, and experience some aspects of Jewish spirituality. Madrichol/songleader Julia Kleinberg leads us in tefillah!

#### **HEALTH GUIDELINES:**

Students will be asked to wash or sanitize hands regularly.

#### Please keep your children at home if they:

- a) have a fever or have had one in the previous 24 hours;
- b) are vomiting or have had intestinal disturbance in the previous 24 hours;
- c) have heavy nasal discharge and/or cough;
- d) have discharge from eye(s);
- e) test positive or have symptoms of COVID or flu or a possible communicable disease.

If your child shows symptoms of illness upon arrival or during the school day, we will call and request that the child be picked up.


If your child will be absent, please email or call and leave a message at 607-256-1471, and contact your child's teacher as well.

Also please be sure that we have contact and emergency contact information should your child become ill during the morning.

Family weddings and bmitzvah celebrations are good excuses for missing school; help your child be ready to talk with the class about their visit to another Jewish community! Contact the teacher to find out about missed work.

Families will have a chance to eat together, sing together, sometimes craft together, and students will have the opportunity to share and demonstrate what they are learning. #### High Holidays at Tikkun v'Or

The ROSH HASHANAH YOUTH AND FAMILY SERVICE is at Tikkun v'Or on September 21 from 9:30-11:30 am. The are no JLE classes, and this program is for the whole family! Students will be leading the short service, tasting new fruits, and blowing the shofar. You do not need to register for this!
